

Green Budget Coalition experts available to comment on federal budget - including climate, housing, nature, agriculture, green economy, and affordability

Ottawa (April 15, 2024) - Many <u>Green Budget Coalition</u> experts will be available to provide comments on the April 16 federal budget regarding a wide variety of timely climate, housing, nature, agriculture, and green economy issues, including how they relate to cost-of-living concerns.

The Green Budget Coalition hopes to see progress in the budget on its following <u>Recommendations for Budget 2024</u>, which were <u>presented to the Deputy Prime Minister</u> on March 1:

- Renovation wave for climate resilient homes and affordable home energy including efficiency and resiliency measures for new and existing homes, particularly for low-income households
- Financing nature protection and recovery in Canada
- Sustainable agriculture
- Advancing a zero-emissions electricity grid based on renewables
- Sustainable jobs for a net-zero Canada
- Plus complementary and sub-recommendations addressing many issues including: public finance and other subsidies for fossil fuels; Parks Canada funding for new protected areas; restoration and a national seed strategy; sustainable agriculture value chains; and circular economy (reuse and repair).
